Trustee Snellgrove introduced General Council Ken Tinkler:

- Ken Tinkler General Council: The Governor has begun a Phase-1 of the opening process. Restaurants are opening with lower occupancy. At this point, Hillsborough County has opened wilderness parks only not public parks or skate parks or dog parks. The best way to learn about policy is to default to the Hillsborough County website. They have not given a timeline for opening the parks. Most likely, it will be next week two weeks after the Governor's original order. This will be dependent on CDC guidelines regarding social distancing.
- Trustee Snellgrove asked the attorney to elaborate: You are a special district designated by the Governor, and that distinction could be taken away. The County has the expertise in following the Governor's orders, and as an entity within the county, the special district should follow County guidelines.
- Jim Powell: I think it is prudent to follow Hillsborough County as long as cases don't spike.
- **Bryan Huls:** Will this change happen on the Governor's Thursday meeting? Ken Tinkler said that Hillsborough County has not made the step yet and neither has the state.
- **Kevin Shidler:** The Board must consider that there is no guard or security at Scotty Cooper Park (meaning, there is no one to address social distancing regulations). At Scotty Cooper Park, we are responsible for too many people gathering at the park, for example, ten people on the peer fishing. Council recommends posting the order from the state. **Trustee Shidler:** so moving forward, White Sands Beach could open at dawn as usual, when the order is changed.
- **Chrisie Price:** Are there specific rules about cleaning the bathrooms. Ken Tinkler advised that we don't know what those rules are yet. If there is a question, defer to the CDC website.
- Trustee Siddall: Will we open White Sands Beach? And will that put us in more liability?
- Trustee Snellgrove: There is confusion about White Sands beach.
- **Ken Tinkler:** The beaches that have opened outside of Hillsborough County are places where social distance requirements can easily be met. Your park (White Sands Beach) fits more into the description of a neighborhood park, not a beach.
- Trustee Siddall: The boat ramp is closing at 4:30 when it used to be opened later.

- **Trustee Shidler:** The problem is people are abusing the privilege, and we have to pay extra for the guard when people don't follow the rules.
- Trustee Siddall: Do we need another meeting if the Governor opens the parks?
- Ken Tinkler: I think, given the way you operate, your president can make that decision.
- Mark Snellgrove: I am in full agreement with that. In my view, if we have any issues, Ken has to defend our actions.

6. Regular Agenda

Suzan Giunta — Vice President & Grounds

- Trustee Giunta: Resident Brian Huls mentioned having work done at Duck Island to trim the trees and pull the weeks. Trustee Giunta asked if she could reach out to someone with a lawn service. There is a proposal from ASI on the agenda to clear the island on Samara, but the Trustee said she could probably get a better price. Trustee Snellgrove said that ASI is not responding to emails.
- There will be a three percent increase in the grounds maintenance budget. **Trustee Snellgrove**, asked what we are getting for our money?
- Trustee Siddall said, if they find something broken, they provide an estimate to fix it.
 Trustee Giunta said that we can probably cancel that part of the contract. Green
 Thumb is charging \$780 to check our irrigation system, which includes all the zones. In regard to the grounds maintenance, there does not seem to be accountability. Trustee
 O'Donnell stated that if that what it costs to check sprinklers, we should open a sprinkler checking business.

Mark Georgiades — Treasurer Matters:

- Trustee Georgiades: I received from Trustee Price the estimated cost of \$35,000 for the refurbishing of the entry signs on Lake Carroll Way. I've also heard from Trustee O'Donnell in regard to budgeting Scotty Cooper Park. I request all Board members to send in their budgets.
- We received an invoice for an ice-machine purchased last summer. They tried to use our credit card. It did not work. It took them nine months to get back in touch with us. **Trustee Siddall** asked the cost of the ice-machine: \$1,900.
- **Lucas Howes** (a resident) joined the meeting at 7:03 p.m.

Mark Snellgrove – President Matters:

• Trustee Snellgrove:

- A legal notice for the upcoming budget hearing was published in the Tampa Bay Times Newspaper on May 6, 2020
- Question: Would the Board like to request an Off-Duty Deputy Sheriff for WSB on: May 25, (Memorial Day Weekend) and any other weekend thereafter?
- **Personnel Matters** Janet Bourland started work today at 2:00 p.m. Prior to Laura Allegri, the hours were three hours per day, five days a week. Janet retired

from her job. We need to provide some financial security, so we have assigned the office hours of 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. Trustee Siddal asked if she could work until 6:30. **Trustee Snellgrove** said he would check on it. Moving forward, Laura and Shelley will only get paid when they are training Janet.

- **Shelley Stewart** recommended Janet Bourland's husband for the maintenance position.
- Trustee Giunta said he looks like a good candidate
- Trustee Siddall had recommended a person (numerous times) but the person has not been given an opportunity to interview for the position. Trustee Snellgrove asked if the gentleman was Trustee Siddall's neighbor. Trustee Siddal stated that he hardly knows the gentleman. He's just someone from the neighborhood. Trustee Shidler suggested that Trustee Snellgrove interview the gentleman and make a recommendation. Trustee Costa suggested that Trustee Snellgrove interview any qualified candidates and make a recommendation to the Board.
- **Shelley Stewart** has done a phenomenal job; she loves helping the community. If you see her, thank her.
- **The Trustee** has requested the restrooms be cleaned once per week.
- Room rental request: The Anderson family would like to rend the Rec Center for a few hours. Their fishing club would pay for it. **Trustee Snellgrove** asked for comments: **Trustee Costa** asked if they would pay the standard \$400 deposit. The **Trustee** replied yes. **Trustee Shidler** asked how long we typically rent the room for? **A:** \$435 w/dance floor, \$335 w/o dance floor. **Trustee Shidler** believes that we should charge our normal fee, not a prorated fee. **Trustee Giunta** said that this would set a precedent.
 - **Trustee Siddal** stated that the Governor is talking about opening the parks
- **Trustee Shidler:** We should request officers for memorial weekend in anticipation of the beaches opening. **Trustee Siddall** suggested 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Michael Carelli — Original Carrollwood Park: Not Present.

• Trustee Carelli: No new business.

Kevin Shidler — White Sands Beach:

• Trustee Shidler: We should follow the guidance of Council.

David O'Donnell — Scotty Cooper Park:

• Trustee O'Donnell: No new business. The Trustee is awaiting quotes for securing SCP.

Trustee Costa said that as duly elected officials, the Board should simply make the

decision to either secure or not secure the park and to not canvas the entire neighborhood for opinions. **Trustee O'Donnell** agreed, as did **Trustee Shidler**. **Trustee O'Donnell** added that he would likely have a budget for securing the park next month. **The Trustee** was not happy with the initial details of the bids and has asked that they all be redone.

- Trustee O'Donnall: Said that someone cut the chain locking SCP.
- **Trustee O'Donnell:** Is there a timetable for conversion of the poles at SCP? **Trustee Snellgrove**: Ownership of the poles has been transferred to the Board.

Paul Siddall — Recreation Center & Tennis

• **Trustee Siddall:** The Trustee is trying to make contact with the Tennis company so they can work on the courts. **The Trustee** is awaiting a call.

Trustee Price — Community Development:

• Trustee Price: Re: Budget Request for Entryway signage: The project includes removal of the existing structures, zoning approval, design, engineering, permitting, fabrication, and installation with foundation of two new monument signs that meet current code. The Trustee would like to contract for this as a turnkey, design-build, if the rules allow, as the vendor has received zoning approval and provided the designs. The scope does not include replacement of the landscaping or up-lighting as needed. The requested budget for this project is \$35,000.

7. Other Business:

- **Trustee Snellgrove:** Eric Palenberg of the CCA Board voiced concern (i.e. social distancing) about the July 4th celebration at White Sands Beach.
- **Paul Siddall:** Suggested that we must follow State, County and CDC guidelines, and if the guidelines are the same as now, we will not be able to have this celebration.
- Trustee Shidler: It seems to me that the Board should move forward with some event on July 4th, which is two months away. Trustee Siddall said the contract should be written with a caveat that takes the social distancing rules into consideration, in case the event has to cancel. Trustee Siddall further stated that Hillsborough County schools don't even know if they will open up summer sports. Trustee Snellgrove asked about the July 4th Parade. Trustee Siddal stated that we must follow social distancing rules. Trustee Snellgrove only stated this because it was mentioned by a member of the CCA Board and we should be Boards that share all information.
- **Trustee Siddall:** Can you make sure you speak to Janet about the tricks people have in trying to get boat stickers? **Trustee Shidler** responded, already done.
- Trustee Snellgrove reopened Public Comment at 8:27 p.m. There were no comments.

• Andrea Griffie: Reported that an article written for the Caroler — at the suggestion of the Board — has been written. The article has been sent to the CCA so that it may be placed in the Caroler. Andrea thanked Trustee Snellgrove for setting up a meeting with a Deputy Sheriff who offered advice for securing Scotty Cooper Park. The Deputy did recognize a "photo" of someone at the park — a man named "Catman." The Deputy was surprised that the individual was spotted at the SCP.

The Deputy commented what to look for in making the park a safer environment:

- Poor visibility into the park. He recommended that the hedges and a small tree follow guidelines, which include being cut down to two feet.
- Recommended that the gate be secured and elevated.
- Recommended better lighting, including in the pavilion.
 LED lighting was preferable.
- Electricity and water fountains attract people, he noted.
- If there is a need for boarder vegetation, look for bougainvillea, or plants that will keep people out.
- The lighting could also be redirected, for example, downward, so it doesn't blind those looking into the park.
- He offered to do a "professional" survey.
 - Dave Williams: Mr. Williams noted that there are eighteen million people on unemployment (the assumption being that they have time to wonder into areas where they perhaps don't belong). He has encountered youths from outside of the neighborhood riding bikes in the parks and has asked them to leave. He also noted that the Crime Watch signs in the neighborhood, are covered in mildew, and that the guard service at WSB is doing a great job.
 - **Dr. Anna Brown:** Many families are having a difficult time. The Hillsborough County Schools website has information on 187 sites around the county where food will be available for families in need.

Suzan Giunta — Vice President & Grounds

Trustee Guinta: is getting quotes for sod. So far, the bids are approximately \$10,000.

Trustee Shidler: Do we have the money?

Trustee Carelli: We should buy plugs and let Costa and his Boy Scouts do the work.

Trustee Costa: Aside from the using the Scouts, I do agree with Carelli that putting plugs is

better than sodding Lake Carroll Way.

Board Consensus: There is no money in the budget for sod.

Mark Georgiades — Treasurer Matters:

 Trustee Georgiades: Asked for thoughts from the Board Members on the 2020-2021 Budget.

- Has made contact with the property appraiser to levy the taxes in the district.
- Trustee Snellgrove said this action is leading to our public meeting in June.
- Trustee O'Donnell noted that all Board Members should make note of the budget changes caused by the Lake Carroll Way improvement effort. This was further explained by Trustee Carelli.
- Trustee Carelli: To pay for the LCW project, each Board Member agreed to decreasing the funds in their Capital Improvement budgets. The Trustee further explained that capital improvement budget was substantially reduced. The Trustee noted that the 2020-2021 budget should come in at \$620,000 and the 2021-2022 budget should come in at \$630,000. The Board should also keep in mind that the month of lowest cash flow is October.
- Lucas Howes: A resident, joined the meeting at 6:55 p.m. (after Public Comment).
- Trustee Snellgrove: Noted that the Board amended the budget and lowered it—specifically for the LCW project. Trustee Carelli stated that he would look for the information on his spreadsheet so that Trustee Georgiades could have that information.

Mark Snellgrove – President Matters:

- **Trustee Snellgrove:** Explained his discussion with the Board Attorney Kenneth Tinkler in regard to closing neighborhood parks:
 - Given the desire to keep the boat ramp open, consistent with the County's decision to keep some boat ramps open, I recommend the following: Permit access to White Sands Beach to only those authorized to access the boat ramp. Close White Sands Beach to all activity except, during the hours that the guard is present. Permit:
 - Launching a boat
 - Parking vehicles during boating operations
 - Use of restroom facilities by individuals who gain access for boating activities.
 - Post the CDC signs on the bathroom facility.

- **Trustee Siddall:** Suggested that the Board put signs at the parks that read: CLOSED. Other Board Members agreed. **Trustee Snellgrove** said he would have notices posted on all the park fences.
- Lucas Howes: A resident said he would be happy to pressure wash signage at the SCP before it reopens.
- **Trustee Snellgrove** noted that maintenance worker, Kevin, quit. He was not comfortable working in this environment. **Trustee Snellgrove** has someone else cleaning the restrooms.
- **Trustee Siddall:** We won't have to worry about maintenance until about mid-July, when things open up again.
- Office Manager Search Recommendation as noted by: Shelley Stewart & Laura Allegri
- **Shelley Stewart:** "Laura and I had the privilege of interviewing five candidates for the office job. What we realized is that the job requires excellent coordination skills. Laura has done it aptly for six years. She leaves huge shoes to fill. Our choice, **Janet Bourland**, is on the call. She lives in the neighborhood and she coordinates much more in her regular job duties. She has the skill to take over this job. **Trustee Snellgrove** asked Janet Bourland to address The Board.
- Janet Bourland: (Excerpts). An accomplished professional with more than 25 years of office management and customer service experience, Janet feels her diverse background brings strong organizational and communication skills to the table. She excelled in all aspects of her career. Her current position is accounting, reservations and bookings. She is a licensed real estate agent. She understands property management and scheduling as well as managing budgets, so this job is a perfect opportunity. She is in a financial position to partially retire and this part time job is perfect for her. She also noted: "I'm a proud Carrollwood Resident for the past six years. I am working fulltime but would give notice and retire if hired."
- Mike Carelli: asked three questions that he typically asks of new hires.
- **Carelli**: I'm out with your former employer and I ask, what is Janet's best quality?
 - **Janet:** My enthusiastic attitude. I never say no. I go over and above. My excellent communication skills.
- Carelli: Everybody has a weakness. What could Janet improve on?

 Janet: I don't' see anything that I can't improve on. I am meticulous. I have learned how to be detailed and meticulous.
- Carelli: What are you most proud of?
 Janet: I'm proud of everything I've accomplished. And Carrollwood has always been my

dream community. The friendliness. I could have had many homes at cost, but I chose Carrollwood.

- Motion by **Trustee Siddall** to hire Janet Bourland to work in the Rec Center Office.
- Motion Seconded by Trustee Costa (based not only on Janet's excellent answers to Trustee Carelli's questions, but also on Shelley's and Laura's recommendations.

Vote: 9 in favor, 0 opposed

- Trustee Snellgrove: Compensation is \$14/hour, 20 hours per week. I don't want Janet to be alone, so I'd like to have Shelley and/or Laura with her.

 Janet's "tentative" start date is April 27th, but that is yet to be determined.
- **Trustee Shidler:** Said he did want to make sure that Janet had enough time to give notice at her job.
- Trustee Siddall: Suggested that Janet begin two weeks before the end of May
- **Trustee Snellgrove:** Asked Laura Allegri what she thought. Laura said she would be available until May 28th.
- **Trustee Carelli:** Laura, what do you think is a reasonable timeframe? Laura said training could be done in two weeks.
- Trustee Siddall: Suggested that <u>Janet start on May 11th.</u> That would give two weeks and four days for training. The Trustee also asked about the increase in hours from three to four hours. Trustee Snellgrove confirmed that.
- Motion by Trustee Price to authorize Secretary Costa to publish a notice for a Public Hearing to run in the Tampa Bay Times newspaper not less than 21-days BEFORE the Public Hearing for the 2020-2021 budget (notice included in the agenda).
- Motion Seconded by Trustee Giunta Vote: 9 in favor, 0 opposed
- **Green Thumb Nursery** the contractor for the Lake Carroll Way landscape median project has invoiced the District \$6,822.21 MORE than what was approved in the December 9, 2019 regular meeting minutes. The authorized amount has been paid, but not the \$6,822.21. Board approval is required.
- Trustee Giunta: Additional costs include boring, to run additional lines underground.
 The Trustee had to make a snap decision, under special circumstances, since the board could not meet.
- **Kevin Shidler:** Did we leave the "irrigation cost" open because they could not give an exact cost? **Trustee Giunta:** we approved estimated figures on irrigation and landscaping. We weren't aware of the cost of using ground penetrating radar.

- Trustee Costa: Asked where the additional funds would come from? Trustee Giunta, having anticipated additional cost, reminded the Board not to spend additional funds until the project was paid for.
- **Trustee Price:** Was the cost written up in a change order, or was there a "not to exceed" amount? **Trustee Carelli** concurred. The answers was "no."

• **Trustee Price:** In regard to the signage at the Lake Carroll Way entrance, she has spoken to the county about a variance.

- Lucas Howes: Reiterated that he would be happy to pressure wash signage at the SCP before it reopens. Chlorine will be involved. Trustee O'Donnell thanked Lucas for the offer.
- **Paul Siddall:** We need to do an annual inspection of the swing sets. We need to inspect for metal fatigue. While we have this down period, can should find someone to perform and inspection.
- **Dave Williams:** There was a piece of metal at the park. I took my saw and cut it away because it was a concern.
- Trustee Price: On my street, there are people cleaning the stop signs. It is easily done.


