Michael Carelli — Original Carrollwood Park:

- Trustee Carelli: addressed the question from public comment regarding the tax referendum increase. The Trustee indicated the referendum will ask the community for approval to increase the tax cap to \$1,200 per year, but the plan is to do the increase over a period of years and-not all at once.
- **Trustee Carelli**: recommended the Board replace two leaking and rusted water fountains @ OCP.
- <u>Motion</u> by <u>Trustee Carelli</u> to Award Channelside Plumbing Inc. a contract to replace two
 water fountains with new ADA compliant fountains; and with an environmental bottle fill
 station in the amount of \$3,675.00
- Motion seconded by Trustee Shidler

Kevin Shidler — White Sands Beach:

- Trustee Shidler: reported that a resident from Phoenix Circle indicated a portion of the block wall that borders the Recreation Center preserve had broken off two weeks ago the section that ends at the Lake Lipsey shoreline. The Trustee will find out who the homeowner is to follow up. The homeowner was-not the resident that reported it.
- **Trustee Shidler:** reported that the damaged boat ramp gate will be replaced soon. The new gate is currently in production.

Jack Griffie — **Scotty Cooper Park**:

- Trustee Griffie: reported that new signage for park rules has been posted @ SCP.
- **Trustee Griffie**: reported that the District is eligible to purchase playground mulch from a contract that Hillsborough County has negotiated. This is referred to as "cooperative purchasing" between government agencies. There are also other items on the purchase list that the District can benefit from.

Suzan Giunta - Grounds:

- **Trustee Giunta:** is-not pleased with the District's lawn contractor's performance. They are sometimes non-responsive.
- **Trustee Carelli:** suggested it is good practice to speak with different lawncare providers every 3-years.
- **Trustee Giunta:** reported that February will mark 3-years with ASI and is in favor of rebidding the contract.
- **Trustee Price:** it seems we are just doing band-aid repairs with irrigation.
- Trustee Giunta: reported that there is a new irrigation timer @ SCP.

Dr. Anna Brown — Recreation Center & Tennis:

- **Trustee Brown:** is working to get the security monitoring at the Recreation Center operational again. The Trustee has replaced the old DVR and old hard drive with new ones, along with a new power supply box.
- Trustee Carelli: asked some technical questions regarding the cameras, and Trustee Brown will get the answers and report at the January meeting for final Board approval. Trustee Carelli recommended not to reduce the number of cameras. The Board agreed to keep the same number of cameras that the old system had, which was eight.

Chrissie Price — Community Development:

• Trustee Price: is finalizing the Request for Proposal (RFP) to solicit a marketing and communications firm for the tax referendum. The Trustee will ask the general counsel to review and approve prior to sending it out.





Resolution 2022-1

A Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Carrollwood Recreation District

Resolved by the Board of Trustees ("Board") of the Carrollwood Recreation District ("District"):

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the current amount of revenue generated by the Carrollwood Recreation District Tax is insufficient to address and maintain required and existing improvements to District property; and

WHEREAS, to fund the financial needs of the District, the Board finds that it is necessary to increase the maximum amount of the Carrollwood Recreation District Tax that may be assessed each year to pay for current and additional new improvements to District property and maintenance of such improvements; and

WHEREAS, for these reasons, the Board approves placing a referendum on the August 23, 2022 ballot proposing to change the maximum annual assessment of the Carrollwood Recreation District Tax that may be considered each year by the Board when the annual budget is developed.

Now, therefore the District resolves as follows:

- 1. The District directs the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections to place on the August 23, 2022 ballot a referendum regarding a change to the maximum annual assessment of the Carrollwood Recreation District Tax from \$600 to \$1,200, assessed against each improved residential parcel, both homes and townhomes, as specified in Exhibit A.
- 2. The Supervisor of Elections shall fix the cost of holding the referendum at an amount to be approved by the District, and the District shall pay that amount to the Supervisor of Elections.
- 3. The District shall publish notice of the referendum in a newspaper of general circulation at least twice in the 30 days immediately preceding the referendum.
- 4. The Supervisor of Elections is authorized and directed to canvas the returns on behalf of the District and to announce the results upon completion of same.

The purpose of the public hearing is to consider placing a referendum on the August 23, 2022 ballot proposing to change the maximum annual assessment of the Carrollwood Recreation District Tax. This existing assessment is a non-ad valorem annual assessment imposed on each individual improved residential parcel located within the boundaries of the District, that's purpose is to fund the financial needs of the District. The current maximum annual assessment that may be imposed by the District is \$600 per each improved residential parcel within the District. The proposed change would increase the maximum annual assessment that could be imposed to \$1,200 for each improved residential parcel within the District.

If approved by a majority of those voting in a referendum, the District in its annual budgeting process could consider imposing the Carrollwood Recreation District Tax in any amount up to the approved maximum per residential parcel of \$1,200 per year. The assessment would be levied against each improved residential parcel, both single family homes and townhomes, once every year after its approval. The assessment will be collected by the Hillsborough County Tax Collector. Failure to pay the assessment will cause a tax certificate to be issued against the subject property, which may result in a loss of title to that property, pursuant to the requirements of Florida law. All affected property owners have a right to appear at the meeting and to file written objections with the District within 20 days of the date of this notice. Written objections may be mailed to

Florida should warn swimmers when there's poop in the water | Column

A legislative proposal would require Florida's health department to post advisories at public bathing places where the water contains fecal bacteria.

The Florida Legislature has had a tough time maneuvering through the politics of clean water to effectively curb pollution and protect public health.

The Legislature enacted the "Clean Waterways Act of 2020" with great fanfare, but though penalties were increased, the law was light on enforceable regulations to curb pollution. Instead, it continues to rely on largely



voluntary and presumed compliance with state regulations. It also ignored many key recommendations of the Governor's Blue-Green Algae Task Force. Howard Simon [Provided]

But as it convenes for its 2022 session, the Legislature will have another opportunity — thanks to Sen. Lori Berman of Delray Beach and Rep. Yvonne Hayes Hinson of Gainesville. The two Democratic legislators have introduced the "Safe Waterways Act" (Senate Bill 604 and House Bill 393).

The proposal's most important feature would require (rather than simply authorize) the Florida Department of Health to issue health advisories and — through its network of county health departments — post and maintain warning notices at "public bathing places" where the water has been found to contain fecal bacteria, either fecal coliform, Escherichia coli or enterococci bacteria.

It also would require the Department of Health to notify a municipality or county if such a health advisory is issued within its jurisdiction. The department would be required to maintain such signage until state water quality standards are met.

Currently, the state health department monitors and posts advisories at some coastal beaches and "public swimming areas" under the Healthy Beaches Program, but as the law currently stands, there is no *requirement* that any state, county or municipal agency warn people before they swim or launch their kayak.


It is inconceivable that unsuspecting Floridians and tourists could be recreating in water contaminated with fecal bacteria.

The Legislature must act on this urgently needed proposal.

It is alarming that fecal contamination of Florida's rivers and streams is so widespread. Based on years of monitoring, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection says nearly 9,000 miles of streams and rivers designated for recreation are impaired by fecal bacteria.

High bacteria counts are dangerous. Swimming or wading in contaminated water can cause a host of illnesses and infections, including gastrointestinal distress, rashes and eye irritation.

The sources of the contamination are numerous. They include untreated stormwater, leaks from aging or poorly functioning sewage treatment plants, leaching septic tanks, and runoff from fields that contain animal waste. Gov. Ron DeSantis' Blue-Green Algae Task Force also urged health advisories "to inform the public about the potential health impacts associated with exposure to algae and/or algae toxins."



Requiring government to warn the public of a health threat should not be a heavy lift. Tornado watches and storm warnings are routinely issued by the National Weather Service. Since 1966, the U.S. surgeon general has required tobacco companies to warn consumers that cigarette smoking can cause cancer, heart disease, emphysema and more.

Curbing pollution at its source, rather than dealing with its consequences, clearly is more effective and cost efficient. But absent enforceable pollution-control measures, the least the state can do is provide warnings to the public so people can make an informed decision about whether to wade into the water and risk their health.
